

As one of five successful applicants to the Mayor's Low Emission Neighbourhood Fund, we are creating a green link between Euston Station and Regents Park. We're encouraging the use of a lower-exposure route around the station, increasing footfall to the wonderful businesses of Drummond Street and promoting the area's vibrant identity.

Pocket Parks & Green Walkways

Creating green space that acts as an oasis amongst the chaos of one of London's busiest transport hubs. Sparking conversation about the need for these environments in the city, balancing the urban with the natural.

Planting Schemes

Identifying opportunities for bright and creative planting schemes that add a splash of colour and make Euston a place to explore.

Signage

Wayfinding will direct people to Regents Park at a time when Euston has sadly lost green space and trees. It will also define the Drummond Street zone and help people locate this foodlovers' heaven.

Public Art

Working with MTArt, the local community and businesses to install public art that excites, engages and contributes to a beautiful public space.

To contribute to our green agenda for Euston, we offer our members free recycling through First Mile


Euston Square Underpass

We were successful in applying to TfL's Ambience Partnership Fund – a collaborative effort to improve station entrances and inject some life and vibrancy to them.

We've match funded the project to create an enhanced and more visible entrance with a planting scheme, wayfinding and lighting.

This project is taking place in tandem with other planned TfL improvements to the ticket office.



Air Quality

One of our main areas of focus is air quality, the local environment and Euston's contribution to environmental damage. Not only is Euston Road the source of unacceptable levels of pollution, we also don't know the effect of future construction.

We meet with the air quality and trees working group with HS2 to ensure we are up to date with their plans – how green space will be replaced and how effects of construction on air quality will be mitigated.

Our website's air quality hub shows live pollution data and highlights wellbeing walks in the area. You'll also find a video explaining the clickcollect initiative, directing our members to use delivery spots that will reduce congestion.

We've also struck special deals for our members with Reyooz, reusing and redistributing unwanted office furniture and reducing the carbon footprint of our business community. Oh check out Pedals, the sustainable delivery service who offer our members a discounted rate.







Collective Temperance

Whilst it lay vacant, we snapped up the National Temperance Hospital on Hampstead Road and created a coworking space for creative startups ahead of its due demolition by HS2. Free hotdesking and subsidised offices attracted an innovative young crowd to Euston and showed the wonderful ways you can use empty buildings to the benefit of the local community.

The Camden Collective model encourages creating like-minded networks of knowledge sharing, collaboration and support. We're helping to facilitate a thriving community of businesses that may not otherwise survive the harsh economic environment of London, and watching the local economy benefit as a result.









Financials 2017

Whilst most of the business rates collected by Central government are distributed elsewhere in the country, the BID levy represents just 1%* of these rates and is 100% ringfenced for EustonTown.




